CONSIDER AND DISCUSS FOR POSSIBLE APPROVAL AN AMENDMENT TO EXISTING ELECTRIC ENERGY CONTRACT WITH CAVALLO ENERGY TEXAS LLC

DISCUSSION:

- Presentation by Ruben De Los Santos, Representative for Cavallo Energy
- Energy Market Update
 - o Power prices have increased
- The district is paying well below current market rates
- The district can enter into a 2nd Amendment to the Agreement
- The District can contract directly with General Land Office and avoid the costly 3rd party fees that Broker assess
- The best pricing now is in the outer years 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025
- The highest pricing periods are the near-term pricing periods
- The District current contract was locked on 12-10-2015 for three years (from 1-1-2016 thru 12-30-2018), Contract Price of .03821
 - On 8-10-2017 a contract amendment for an additional 16-month term (from 1-1-2019 thru 4-30-2020),
 Contract Price .03721

ITEM #7 CONTINUED

- o The District uses 9.260 million kWh per year. 51 Accounts
- The new agreement will be tacked on at the end of the extension, will kick in May 2020
- A Discussion on the second Amendment for Market Watch agreement. Contract price extension term shall not exceed
 \$0.04150 per kWh (Extension Contract Price). For a term of 24 months and will not exceed a term of 84 months.
 - o The District can choose the contract price
 - o Possibly wait and strike then.
 - o Could burden the District beyond 2020. The District can establish a lower target price
 - o Will Future projects (like a windmill) affect contract? The contract will accommodate renewable power.
 - Recommendation for Staff to continue monitoring
 - Staff recommends the Market Watch Agreement. The prices might go down but will go down a little bit, as
 opposed to the probability that it could go up. If prices do go up it could be a risk where we end up losing a
 lot; there is a possibility it could go up well over .5.
 - o If the market watch price term doesn't materialize, then the market term expires. The District will still have almost ten months on the existing contract before it expires.

DISCUSSION:

- The Collections department worked on Gulf Blvd. mainline; it was full of sand
- . The District's vacuum truck broke down and needed a working unit
- The rental is for one month (28 days) for \$8,700.00
- Invoice total \$9,417.75 (included taxes of \$717.75)
- Motion needs to be amended to approve payment of 8,700.00 dollar invoice.
- Why was it rented? The line at Gulf Blvd was filled with sand. Vacuum Truck broke down, and Jetter Truck wasn't doing
 the job. Staff who were using the units reported on the problems.
- Discussion on Sterling truck (unit #33) not working at 100% and the Jetter truck

Why would that line have accumulated all that sand? Preventive maintenance was possibly using a weak hose and not
picking up all the sand.
